Trips, slips, and falls	Pupils, coaches	Medium	Area checked for hazards; suitable footwear required; clear rules for safe movement	Low
Injury from equipment	Pupils, coaches	Medium	Equipment checked regularly; age-appropriate equipment used; instruction given before use	Low
Unsafe playing surface	Pupils, coaches	High	Visual check before session; avoid use if unsafe; indoor alternatives considered	Low



Poor behaviour or rough play	Pupils	Medium	Behaviour expectations set clearly; schools' policies followed; ratio of adults to children monitored	Low
Medical emergency	Pupils	High	Medical info from school; inhalers/meds present; coaches first aid trained	Low
Unauthorised access or child leaving area	Pupils	High	Entry/exit points secured; registers kept; school staff presence required	Low
Safeguarding concern or allegation	Pupils, staff	High	All coaches DBS checked; safeguarding policy followed; concerns reported to DSL	Low



Coach illness or absence	Pupils, school	Medium	Backup coach or school informed; session cancelled if unsafe	Low
Manual handling	Coaches	Low	Trolleys used if possible; training provided on lifting	Low
Fire or emergency evacuation	Pupils, coaches	Medium	Follow site fire procedures; identify exits; register kept	Low
COVID-19 / Infectious disease	Pupils, coaches	Variable	Follow public health guidance; hygiene practices; equipment cleaned	Low



General Control Measures

- All coaches:
 - Hold enhanced DBS clearance.
 - Are trained in child protection and emergency first aid.
 - Wear identifiable clothing and carry ID.
- - Equipment is:
 - Cleaned and stored safely.
 - Regularly inspected for wear and damage.
- - Pre-session safety check:
 - Coach to assess surface, space, equipment, and emergency procedures.
- - Supervision:
 - Coach-to-pupil ratios maintained.
 - School staff or designated adult must be present.

Documentation & Emergency Procedures

- - Registers taken at each session.
 - Accident forms completed and shared with schools if needed.
 - Contact details for schools/coaches accessible.
 - Incident log maintained.



Review & Monitoring

- Risk assessment reviewed annually or after:
 - A significant incident or near-miss.
 - Change in environment, staffing, or equipment.
 - New guidance from schools or public health.
